Good Response To Mandatory Pass Plan

Response to the mandatory seasonpass plan announced last month for non-fairway lot owners has been quite good.

Under this new plan, lot owners who have property anywhere within Indian Lake other than along the fairways of the new 18-hole championship golf course may purchase a mandatory season-pass and have unlimited family privileges on all the year 'round recreational facilities.

Cost of a mandatory season-pass for non-fairway lot owners is \$200 a year, and the fee must be paid each year as a covenant to the property deed. The covenant is based upon the 1969 Consumer Price Index published by the U. S. Department of Labor. This means that the mandatory fee could remain the same indefinitely, or be adjusted up or down according to the cost of living.

The mandatory season-pass offers a substantial savings from the \$300 all-inclusive pass and includes unlimited family privileges on the ski slopes, swimming pool, ice skating pond, tennis court, 9-hole golf course and the Arnold Palmer course on which only fairway lot owners and other mandatory season-pass holders will be permitted to play within the next few weeks through a special preview arrangement.

All future lot sales at Indian Lake will contain the mandatory season-pass provision.

Anyone interested in signing up for a mandatory season-pass may do so by stopping at the sales office at the Air-Park.

McIntyre, executive secretary of Indian Lake, and permanent board member of the Service Corp., opened the meeting by reading last year's minutes. Following approval of the minutes, Mitchell Withrow, secretary of the Service Corp., presented the year's financial statement. A suggestion from a lot owner to provide a more detailed financial report was agreed upon and

Lot owners Harry Larabee and Ralph Guarino were nominated to fill the expired terms of Mitchell Withrow and Paul Wagner. The biggest part of the meeting was taken up by discussions about the lake—its safety patrol and water level. The board of directors acknowledged the fact that the water level now is slightly higher than normal, but reminded everyone that the situation may not be the same in August after

a prolonged dry spell. A motion to maintain the water level 9-inches above the spillway was defeated. It was then decided that the board of directors should hold a special meeting and decide on a policy that would take into account heavy spring rains and severe summer drought in maintaining a reasonably consistent water level.

Other important topics discussed at the meeting are as follows:

—Regulations for boating on the lake are good, but boating could be more enjoyable if everyone obeyed the rules.

—Bill Collingwood, lake patrol officer, is doing a good job but it would help if lot owners would cooperate in keeping reckless boaters in check.

—Drastic action could be taken against unauthorized persons boating and fishing on the lake if lot owners would immediately speak up and notify the proper authorities about such violations.

—The frequency with which unauthorized persons are on the premises of Indian Lake could be kept at a minimum if gates were installed at the main entrances.

—Fishing is good at Indian Lake but it could be improved if more lot owners got behind the fishing club and gave it more financial help.

—Indian Lake in general could be an even better place if everyone gave their wholehearted support to all activities, including the fishing club and Lodge.

—A new agreement is in the making between Allegheny Mountain Lakes, Inc., developer and owner of Indian Lake roadways, and Indian Lake Borough, which is charged with the responsibility of policing the roads. It is hoped that the new agreement will provide for added police protection throughout the development.

—A reminder that youngsters must be over 16 to ride mini-bikes on Indian Lake roads.

—Resurfacing of Indian Lake roads is nearly completed and everyone agrees that the project is a big improvement.

The meeting ended on a rather light note when Mrs. Dorothy DeVilling stood up and asked if it would be possible to keep the golf course sprinklers turned off for the ladies on their golf day. Latest report is that her request was compiled with and all the lady golfers are happy.





AIRPORT EXPANDS WITH NEW RUNWAY

Indian Lake has expanded its airport facilities by opening a new 4,500foot paved runway at the northern end of the sprawling wooded peninsula already dotted with vacation homes and the new 18-hole championship golf course which Arnold Palmer designed to surround the airport complex.

The new airstrip is 100-feet wide and has a 500-foot unpayed overrup at the northwest end, making it 5.000-feet.

Designed to accommodate all types of single engine, light twin engine and light jet aircraft, the new runway extends northwest-southeast and is connected to the resort's existing 3,000foot northeast-southwest paved runway. The existing runway is also used as a taxiway.

Operational facilities at Lake's airport include unicom system, fuel service center, and a maintenance shop with an FAA licensed mechanic and inspector. The flight training school, which is equipped with the latest Link Trainer, is approved by the Federal Aviation Administration and the Veterans Administration under the Pennsylvania Department of Public Instruction.

Indian Lake's airport opened to traffic in November, 1966. It is licensed by the Federal Aviation Administration.

Official dedication of the new runway is planned for September.
