Private Pilot Ground School to Begin April 19

New Six-Week Session Open To Men, Women, Boys and Girls

A six-week private pilot ground school will be held at Indian Lake Air-Park for men, women and boys and girls 16 years of age and older.

The school will be conducted from April 19 to May 24 and will be given for men and women from 7:30 to 10:00 p.m. Fridays. Instructions for boys and girls over the age of 16 will be given from 9:30 a.m. to noon on Saturdays, beginning April 20

The course is designed primarily to prepare students for Federal Aviation Agency's written examination for a private pilot rating. Class material is organized in six sections, beginning with a preview of the aviation field and ending with the FAA regulations. Other sections cover flying preliminaries, flight computer, navigation and meteorology.

Ground school classes are separate from actual flight instruction. Students must pass the written examination before taking a flight test. There are no prerequisites.





Fundamentals of Claybird Shooting


Trap and Skeet

Targets in skeet shooting are always thrown in the same pattern of flight, but the angle of the shot varies because the shooter changes positions by moving from station to station. While shooters also change positions in trap shooting, the basic difference comes from the fact that in trap the targets are thrown at various angles unknown to the shooter. The diagrams printed below illustrate these basic principles.





The diagram above shows a trap field with the shooter at Station Two. Note the other three stations that the shooter must use during his round of 25 shots. The diagram also indicates the various angles in which the targets are thrown from the target house.



This diagram shows a skeet field with the shooter at Station Three. There are eight stations that the shooter must use during his round of 25 shots. The diagram also indicates the high and low houses from which targets are always thrown in the same flight pattern. The angle of the shot varies because the shooter changes positions. In this diagram the shooter breaks a target from the high house.
