Babysitting Service Now Available

A babysitting service has been arranged through Indian Lake Lodge for the coming summer season. The service will be available in a group rate for Thursdays (Ladies Golf Day) between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. The children will eat their lunch at the Lodge and will be entertained in group activities throughout the day.

A charge of \$4.00 per day for the first child of a family will be made . . . with an additional charge of \$2.00 per child for each additional child of the same family. This will include the sitting service and lunch. The children will be supervised by Indian Lakers Sue Schweitzer and Sandy Garman.

In addition, the sitters will be available for babysitting at homes, in the new hotel, or chalets on other days and evenings of the week. A charge of 50c per hour will be made before midnight and 75c after midnight. It will be necessary for families to furnish transportation for the sitter.

Those desiring the babysitting service, either on Ladies Day or for other times, may call the Lodge office. It will be necessary to make reservations.

Lake-to-Lodge Transportation

Incline Railway Under Construction

A new dimension in resort living is being added to the already varied list of enjoyable activities for Indian Lakers.

An incline railway designed to provide Indian Lake boating enthusiasts and their guests with almost direct transportation from the lake to the Lodge is under construction and scheduled for completion later this summer.



Groundbreaking Wednesday, May 15 marked the start of construction on the inclined railway that will be used to carry passengers from the lake area at the base of the ski slopes up to the Lodge.

The incline is being built next to the poma lift near the center of the ski slopes. A 700-foot steel track installed over the natural contour of the ski slope will be

used to carry a single 8-passenger electricalley powered car. Vertical drop in this area is 240 feet. Installation of the track is expected to be completed by the middle of June. Boat docking facilities will be provided at the base of the ski slopes. Construction of the railway system has been approved by the Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry.

To Indian Lakers and their guests, this new facility puts the 9-hole golf course, tennis court, swimming pool and Lodge as near as your boat.

Riding Stable Officially Opens Season June 2

Riding Academy for Youngsters Is an Added Feature This Year

Indian Lake Riding Stable officially opens its season Sunday, June 2.

While this will be only the second year of operation for the stable, it appears to be headed for a busy season. Unprecedented growth in horseback riding in recent years will have a lot to do with this. But riding stable manager Ward Miller likes to think that Indian Lakers will be riding more because of the many improvements at the stable.

Everything is in excellent condition. There's a new tack room with more equipment. More fence has been installed around the stable area, and new riding trails have been opened.

To keep up with the expected growth, Ward said there will be a total of 26 horses and ponies available for riding. There's still room for anyone who wishes to board their own horses.

Riding Academy

Another added feature this year is the riding academy. This is designed to give children over 12 years of age a week of riding, feeding, watering and general care of horses in a ranch-type atmosphere.

Tuition for a week's schooling is \$75. This includes room and board (3 meals a day), and at least 3 hours of riding a day with an instructor. In addition, there will be swimming, tennis and golf.

Youngsters who enroll in the academy will check in at the stable at 7:00 p.m. Sunday and check out at noon Saturday. Reservations can be made for any week beginning June 2.

Observe the Rules

Behaving on the Golf Course Is Easy

Golf is almost always played in the company of others. Therefore, everyone should understand how to behave on the course. Certain rules, or etiquette, are common to most golfers, even beginners, but they are always worth repeating.

An important thing to remember is that in addition to the safety of others there is a big investment in the golf course itself.

With these thoughts in mind, observing the rules makes more sense.

Here are some basic rules every golfer should know and observe:

1. Repair all divots. Do this by replacing the piece of turf torn up by your club. Press the grass down with your foot to encourage it to take root again.

2. Smooth out holes and marks made when playing out of a sand trap. Use the rakes provided for this purpose.

3. Avoid damaging the putting green. Repair (with a tee or similar object) all ball marks. Don't drop golf bags or the flagstick on the green, or pull golf carts across it. Also, don't lean on your club. It's no fun putting on a scarred green.

4. Do not drive motorized golf cars on or near tees, greens, or bunkers.

5. Do not talk or move while others are playing in your group. Do not stand too close to a player when he's shooting.

6. Do not hit your next shot until players in front are out of range.

7. When looking for a lost ball, allow players behind to pass. Do not hit until they have played through and are out of range.

8. Play without delay. Always be ready to hit when your turn comes.

9. After your group has holed out, go to the next tee immediately. Mark your scoreboard on the tee, not the green.

10. Slow players having an open hole in front should allow players behind to play through.

All golfers should be familiar with the United States Golf Association Rules, particularly the changes that are made each year.

If you have a question about the rules, ask Jim Coleman, or consult your rule book. But remember, etiquette is important and makes golf more enjoyable.

Week-long School Limited To First 20 Applicants

Boys Will Receive Complete Instruction on Important Phases of Golf Fundamentals

Boys between the ages of 8 and 18 have until Saturday, June 15 to register for the junior golf school to be held June 23-29 at Indian Lake.

Enrollment is limited to the first 20 boys so it's important to send applications in now. The school is separate from the Saturday morning junior golf clinic that begins June 29.

The advantage of the school is that all youngsters will be given more individualized instruction. Special instructions will be given on stance, grip, takeaway, follow-through and putting. Etiquette will also be covered during the week-long session.

Denny Robinson, golf school director, said there's been a lot of interest in the school but he does not want to accept more than 20 boys this first year.

Rate for the week's program is \$110. This includes lodging, three meals a day, green fees, golf instruction and swimming.

FAA and VA Approve Indian Lake Flying School

The Federal Aviation Administration and the Veterans Administration under the Pennsylvania Department of Public Instruction have approved the flight training school of Indian Lake Aviation, Inc.

Approval was granted by both agencies on the basis of Indian Lake Aviation having qualified to their requirements in the areas of instruction, personnel, facilities, equipment and curricula for flight training and ground school. Quality of instruction measurement requires that of all flying school graduates who apply within 60 days after graduation, at least 80% must qualify for pilot ratings appropriate to the curriculum from which they were graduated.

As a certificated pilot school under the Federal Aviation Administration, Indian Lake Aviation is now authorized to provide instruction to qualified students in private, commercial, instrument and flight instructor courses.

Approval by the Veterans Administration, together with FAA approval, permits Indian Lake Aviation to provide flight instruction to veterans under the Veterans Pension and Readjustment Assistance Act of 1967.

To qualify as a veteran one must have served in the armed services of the

United States for at least 181 days of continuous active duty and have had his service terminate under conditions other than dishonorable after January 31, 1955.

Other requirements call for a veteran to possess a valid private pilot license or to have satisfactorily completed 35 hours of instruction towards the private pilot rating.

Veteran entitlements for flight training are computed at the rate of \$130 for each month of military service. The Veterans Administration pays 90% of the established charges for tuition and fees which nonveterans in the same course and circumstances are required to pay.

Types of courses approved by the Veterans Administration for Indian Lake Aviation are commercial, instrument and flight instructor.
