Arnold Palmer, architect for Indian Lake's new 18-hole golf course on the peninsula, made an inspection of the championship layout last month with James W. McIntyre, executive secretary of Indian Lake. Darrell Brown, Arnie's pilot, also made the trip to Indian Lake and accompanied the two around the new course. Palmer said he was quite pleased with progress made so far on both the front and back nine.

While touring the back nine, which has had a limited amount of play this summer by only the fairway lot owners and permanent season pass holders, Palmer pointed out a few things he'd like to see done as part of the regular maintenance program. But other than that he thought the course was in good shape. Following his inspection of the back nine holes. Palmer tramped the wooded fairways of the front nine

and outlined specific design features.

Lifesaving

Swim Classes Set For Holidays

Young swimmers aspiring to be lifeguards, or anyone interested in receiving a life saving certificate recognized by the American Red Cross will have a good opportunity to fulfill the requirements during the upcoming Christmas vacation period beginning December 20 and continuing through January 4.

Swimming classes based on the requirements set by the Red Cross will be held during the vacation period with the first class starting at 10 a.m., Saturday, December 20. In order to meet lifesaving standards, it will be necessary to hold 15 two-hour classes during the entire period. A lifesaving certificate is necessary for anyone to qualify as a lifeguard.

Classes will be conducted by Cheryl Stutzman, an accredited swimming instructor who directed the successful swimming program this past summer at the Lodge pool.

Cost of the lifesaving course is \$15 for season pass holders, and \$30 for non-season pass holders. Register at the Lodge office.

Private swimming lessons by appointment only can also be arranged during the holida, period.

MAIL SERVICE INCREASED

The Post Office in Central City has expanded its mail service to Indian Lake and is now making deliveries to parts of the peninsula.

There are 18 permanent and 10 temporary residents now receiving carrier mail service. Mail is also delivered to the offices at the Lodge and Air-Park. The Post Office will continue to expand the service throughout the development as the need increases.

Remember, if you want your mail delivered, the postal regulations require patrons to provide and erect at their own expense rural mail boxes which meet official specifications.

Here are a few tips from the good people at your Post Office.

- —Whenever possible boxes must be located so that carrier's vehicle is off pavement when serving them.
- —Name must be painted on box in letters not less than one-inch high.
- —Post must be neat and of adequate strength and size.
- —Approach to mail box should be a hard level surface (gravel, cinders, stone).
