MAYORAL ADDRESS

The following was submitted by Jay McClatchey, Mayor of the Indian Lake Borough.

The Mayor is the executive branch of the municipal government. The main responsibility of the mayor is the control of the police force. Council has the authority to set the budget of the police department, hire and terminate police officers, and determine the structure of the police department. Borough Code gives the mayor power to direct the police chief and the police force. The mayor decides the time, the place, and the manner in which police officers are to perform their duties.


PA Borough Code clearly places the responsibility for controlling and operating the municipal government in the hands of Council. It does however, give the mayor the right to take part in all discussions and meetings of the council. Borough Code also gives the mayor responsibility for making recommendations to council on matters of borough concern.

Council has the exclusive right to pass an ordinance (law) in the borough, but it must be signed into law by the mayor. If the mayor vetoes an ordinace, a two thirds majority vote is required to override the veto.
