New Membership Year At Indian Lake Lodge

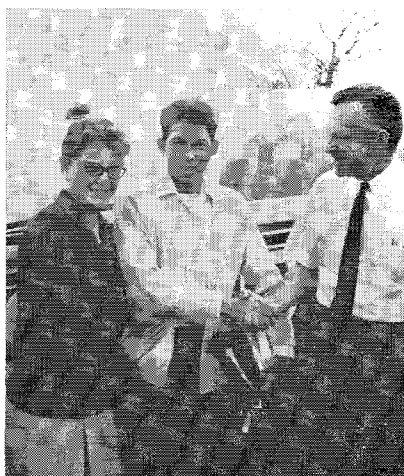

New Six-Week Private Pilot Ground School Opens for Men, Women, Boys and Girls

Late Applications Being Accepted

A six-week private pilot ground school got under way Friday, April 19, at Indian Lake Air-Park. The new session is open to men, women and boys and girls 16 years of age and older.

Instructions are given for men and women from 7:30 to 10:00 p.m. Fridays. Boys and girls over the age of 16 receive their instructions from 9:30 a.m. to noon on Saturdays.

Don Wonders, Air-Park Manager, said late applications are being accepted and that arrangements can be made for students to complete the six-week course on a flexible schedule.

The course is designed primarily to prepare students for the Federal Aviation Agency's written examination for a private pilot rating. Class material is organized in six sections, beginning with a preview of the aviation field and ending with the FAA regulations. Other sections cover flying preliminaries, flight computer, navigation and meteorology.

Ground school classes are separate from flight instruction. Students must pass the written examination before taking a flight test. There are no prerequisites. Total cost for the six-week course is \$50.

Golf School for Boys 8 to 18 To be Held June 23-29

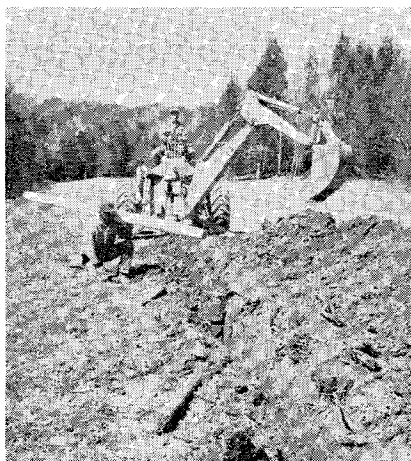
A week-long golf school designed to give boys aged 8 to 18 in-depth instruction on the fine points of golf is set to begin June 23.

The school is separate from the Saturday morning junior golf lessons scheduled to begin June 29.

Enrollment will be limited to 20 boys so it's important to send applications in early. The rate for the week's program, including lodging in the chalets or hotel, three meals a day, green fees and golf instruction, is \$110.

Students in the school will be given special instructions on such things as stance, grip, backswing, follow-through and putting.

Golf Course Construction in Full Swing



Beautiful spring weather has enabled workers to get a big jump on construction of the new 18-hole championship golf course.

Installation of the water line for No's. 14, 15, 16 and 17 is nearly completed. Finished grading and shaping of these four holes and No. 18 will begin after the watering system is tested and put in full operation. Hopefully, these five holes will be seeded by early June. The first four holes of the back nine were seeded last year and are in good shape.

Fairways for the front nine were cut last fall. Rough grading will be completed on these holes this summer in preparation for final design supervision by Arnold Palmer. The 18-hole course is to be completed by 1970.

REGULATIONS FOR THE USE OF INDIAN LAKE

SECTION I—Boating General

(A) **TYPE:** Any type boat in any size is permitted providing the motive power is by oar, sail, outboard motor or inboard-outboard steam drive. No inboard boats are permitted. The maximum speed limit is 40 miles per hour.

(B) **NUMBER:** Only one boat is permitted per lot owner. Should the lot owner have more than one boat, such as a sail boat or a rowboat, only one is permitted on the lake at any one time. (A limited number of licenses are issued at varying costs depending on the type of additional boat).

(C) **LICENSES:** It is required that each boat have displayed on the right front windshield or right prow an Indian Lake license. In addition, the boat must have a Pennsylvania boat license. One Indian Lake license will be issued to each lot owner at no charge. Pennsylvania licenses are available at boat dealers. The Indian Lake license must be called for in person at the Indian Lake Office and will be available by April 15th. No boat will be permitted on Indian Lake without proper license. Penalties for violations in the case of lot owners are listed in Section VI below. Non-lot owners will be prosecuted for trespass.

(D) **LAUNCHING:** All boats must be launched and taken out of the water at the Lake Launch Ramp located on the east shore near the spillway. A proper launch area has been constructed for this specific use. Boats are not permitted to be launched from the lot or any other easement around the lake. The reason for this is so that launch roads will not be cut on each lot and that non-residents can be controlled.

SECTION II—Operation Rules for Boats Special to Indian Lake

(A) A left hand or counter clockwise traffic pattern will be maintained by all boats on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays. This means you keep to the right side of the lake and make all turns to the left when reversing direction.

(B) No boat will be operated at a speed in excess of eight (8) miles per hour when within one hundred feet from shore excepting when taking on or discharging water skiers. When pulling water skiers from shore they shall be pulled in a direction which will enable the boat to enter the traffic in the proper way.

(C) Tow ropes for pulling water skiers shall not exceed seventy-five feet in length, and shall not be left trailing in the water behind the boat unless being used.

(D) Boats pulling water skiers shall have at least one other occupant besides the driver unless the driver has obtained a driver's qualification card and the boat is equipped with a rear view mirror properly mounted.

(E) All boats must stay clear of the ski jump buoyed area unless actually pulling a jumper. When using the jumps all boats and skiers will use courtesy and take their proper turn at the jump. If a skier falls when taking the jump his driver should quickly pick him up so as not to hold up other jumpers.

(F) No water skiing is permitted after sunset. All boats on the water after sunset will display proper lights.

(G) All water skiers must wear an approved type of life preserver or belt and an approved type of preserver shall be in the boat for each occupant.

(H) The driver of a boat must be at least 15 years of age unless he or she has obtained a driver's qualification card.

(I) All drivers must be in the proper position behind the wheel of the boat and all occupants must be in a safe position when the boat is in operation.

(J) All boats must obey the proper rules for overtaking and passing other boats. No buzzing of other boats or shoreline docks will be permitted.

(K) All rules of the U. S. Coast Guard and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania will be observed where applicable.

Copies of these rules are obtained with your Pennsylvania boat license.

(L) The warnings, directions and orders of the Safety Patrol Officer must be observed. If any person feels they have been unjustly treated they must obey at the time but may take the matter in question up with the Corporation Office directly and they will be given a fair hearing by the lake use committee.

SECTION III—Swimming

(A) No swimming will be permitted beyond thirty (30) feet from shore unless the swimmer is accompanied by a boat immediately adjacent to him.

(B) No swimming is permitted beyond one hundred feet from shore on Saturdays, Sundays or holidays after twelve o'clock noon.

(C) In order to protect their swimming area all lake front lot owners are permitted to install a floating buoy not to exceed twelve inches in diameter, painted yellow at a point in line with their lot line at a distance thirty feet from shore. It is requested that lot owners not use any other marker of any type including pennants at or near the shore line of their lot.

SECTION IV—Fishing

(A) No fishing is permitted beyond one hundred feet from shore after eleven o'clock and until sunset.

(B) Until further notice all fishing must be done with artificial lures. No live bait is permitted. As soon as the quality and quantity of fishing has been determined this rule will be revised. All lot owners are especially requested NOT to put any fish into the lake of any type (including minnows) under any conditions.

(C) No particular season will be observed on fishing until further notice. Catch limit on Rainbow Trout will be not less than 12 inches in length and not more than 2 trout per person or 6 per boat in any one day.

DON'T KILL MORE THAN YOU CAN USE.

(D) All lot owners and members of their family will receive free of charge and expense an Indian Lake Fishing license. All guests will be charged \$1.00 per day and must have a license. These can be obtained from the Office, the Safety Officer or at Long's, Marina. This income will be used for the fishing program.

(E) At present a Pennsylvania fishing license is also required. A two mile per hour speed limit will be observed in the two wilderness areas.

SECTION V—Special Boat Licenses

(A) For a limited time some additional boat licenses will be issued for fishing boats with motors not to exceed ten horsepower, row boats, canoes and sail boats. These licenses will be issued on an annual basis and will not necessarily be renewed in subsequent years. Cost as follows:

Row boats and canoes.....	\$ 7.00	Annually
Sail boats	\$10.00	Annually
Fish boats under 5 HP.....	\$10.00	Annually
Fish boats over 5 HP but under 10 HP.....	\$20.00	Annually

The income from these licenses will go into the Indian Lakes Service Corp. General Fund. No additional license will be issued for motor boats over 10 HP. All licenses including those given to each lot owner must state the size, make and power of boat and be affixed to that boat and no other.

(B) Owners are cautioned that the original agreements contain the clause that no commercial use may be made of their lot in any connection whatsoever. It is pointed out that this means sales of boats, rentals or rides. It does not include the use of the lake in the case of an owner renting his cottage to one family

Fishing Club Making Great Strides With Fish Program

Club Needs Support of Everyone; New Membership Drive Underway

Indian Lake Fishing Club held two spring meetings the past month and has decided to increase its efforts to provide property owners with some of the finest fishing in Pennsylvania.

By carefully implementing the recommendations of Marine Biologist Dr. Edwin L. Cooper, and through the cooperation of Allegheny Mountain Lakes, Inc., the club has accomplished a great deal since it was organized last year.

Over four thousand large and small mouth bass and brook trout have been stocked in the lake. A quantity of shiners was purchased recently for the bass to feed on.

There will be no large or small mouth bass fishing this year. It is important that this and other fishing regulations be observed to assure success of the long range program. (See fishing regulations in next column).

Other efforts this year will be:

— Install a screen at the spillway to keep fish from dropping into the spillway bucket.

— Post more "no trespassing signs" around the lake.

— Promote interest in fishing among the children.

— Promote interest in the hole-in-one tournaments to be sponsored this year by the Fishing Club.

Fishing licenses for this year are available at Long's Marina and from any of the fishing club officers or members of the fish committee.

To further advance the fish program in 1968, Allegheny Mountain Lakes, Inc. again will contribute \$400.00 to the club. The corporation's generosity is greatly appreciated. But it takes the support of everyone if Indian Lake is to have good fishing.

who would use the lot owner's boat and license. This is permitted.

SECTION VI—Penalties for Violations

(A) All violations of these regulations will be reported to the Lake Use Committee by the Safety Patrol Officer. For the first violation a warning will be issued. At the second violation a ten dollar fine will be levied; at the third violation a twenty-five dollar fine will be levied. At the fourth violation the license of the owner of the boat will be suspended. If fines remain unpaid for a period of ten days after assessment, the license of the boat owner will be suspended until the fine is paid. It is hoped that no violations will occur but it is in the best interests of safe boating that careless drivers be kept off the lake. It, therefore, is in the best interest of the boat owner that he know who is operating his boat and how.

(B) Changes or amendments to these regulations may be made at any time but will not be made without written notice to each resident of Indian Lake Reservation.

Shanksville Church Services

1968 Indian Lake Fishing Regulations

1. LICENSES

ALL Fishermen must have an Indian Lake Fishing license.

a. Lot owners may obtain a free license from the Lake Patrol, Long's Marina, and Indian Lake Fishing Club Members: Jack Butler, Doctor Davenport, Bill Morris, Charles Platt, Ozzie Livengood, Mitchell Campbell, Paul Fitzsimmons and Bob McGraw.

b. All guests of property owners must have a guest fishing license which may be obtained from the above sources for a fee of \$1.00 per day or \$3.00 per week. All fees received from guest licenses will be used for stocking fish in the lake.

2. FISHING

a. Season

1. No particular season on fishing until further notice except as noted below in paragraph b3.

b. Fish Limits

1. TROUT (RAINBOW OR BROOK) —12" minimum length, 2 per person, and 6 per boat.

2. CALICO BASS—7" minimum length, no daily limit.

3. LARGE AND SMALL MOUTH BASS—All large and small mouth Bass will be illegal during 1968. Both Fingerlings and spawning size fish of both species have recently been stocked in the lake and require one year to propagate.

4. BLUEGILLS AND SUNFISH—No limits.

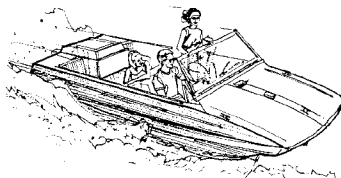
