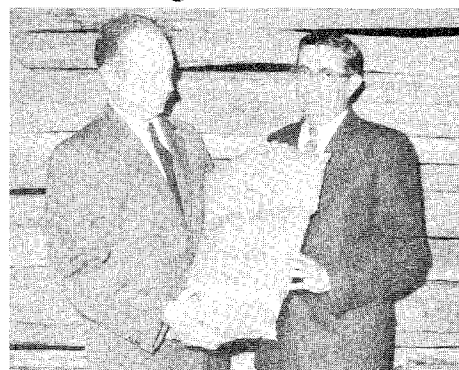

# Demand For Season Pass Hits All-Time High

Plans to open the back nine holes of Arnold Palmer's championship golf course along with the greens fee policy announced last month created so much excitement among lot owners that it triggered an unprecedented demand for a season pass membership - a membership that would include unlimited family privileges for all the Lodge's facilities, plus golfing on the new course without the nuisance of paying a daily greens fee.

Requests for the all-inclusive season pass came from a good cross section of lot owners. Some came from early property owners who have been supporting the Lodge for years, and there are others who want to start for the first time. Many are from recent lot owners who just purchased their lot and want to enhance their investment the easiest way they know how - with a season pass.

## Boat Registration



There wasn't a large turnout at the opening day for Indian Lake boat registration March 21, but since then more than 100 boats have been registered with Indian Lake Service Corporation, sponsors of the sign-up program and policy of lot owners picking up their license in person.

A featured part of the first day's registration included an informative talk and film on boating safety. The program was presented by Joseph Dick, watercraft safety officer of the Pennsylvania Fish Commission. Mr. Dick, and Mitchell Withrow of the Service Corporation are shown above discussing the type of life preserver required on board every boat.

If you haven't registered your boat, better do so quickly and avoid the embarrassment of being caught launching your boat without the 1969 boat license for Indian Lake.

A season pass to include all the recreational facilities was scheduled to be introduced upon completion of the 18-hole course. But response to the announcement to open the back 9 holes of the course designed by Arnold Palmer pushed the plan ahead.

Now, lot owners may purchase a season pass for \$300 and have unlimited family privileges on the back nine of Arnold Palmer's championship golf course on the peninsula, the 9-hole course next to the Lodge, ski slopes, ice skating pond, tennis court and the heated indoor swimming pool.

For \$200, lot owners enjoy unlimited family privileges on all recreational facilities except the Arnold Palmer golf course, where a daily greens fee is required. Weekdays, the fees are \$4 for nine holes, or \$6.50 a day. Saturday, Sunday and Holidays, the fees are \$5 for nine holes, or \$8 a day.

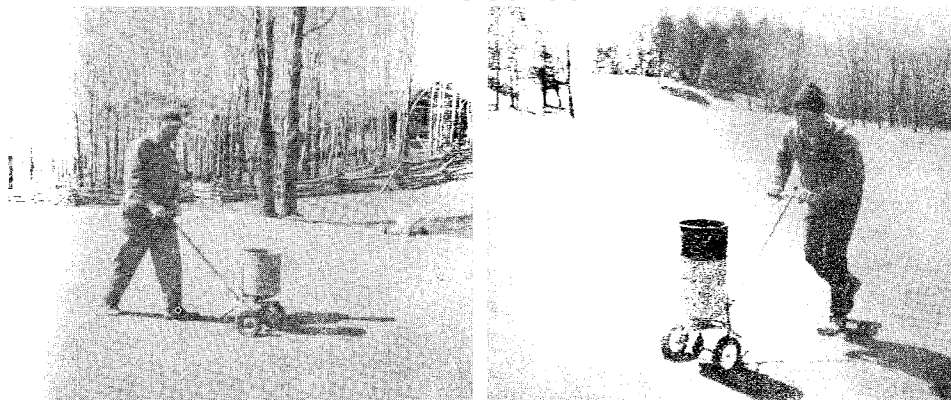
Fairway lot owners, whose season pass is mandatory and fixed-in-cost by their Deed, will continue to pay their present rate and enjoy unlimited family use of all facilities.

Fees for guests of fairway lot owners, season pass holders and hotel guests are \$5 for nine holes weekdays, or \$8 a day. On Saturday, Sunday and Holidays, it is \$6 for nine holes, or \$10 a day.

### Added Benefits

Each season pass holder, in addition to unlimited family recreational privileges, is permitted to bring another family to Indian Lake as guests four times a year - once each quarter - to enjoy the recreational facilities without charge. All that's necessary is to register guests at the Lodge.

## Diet For A Good Golf Course



It takes a steady diet of the right fertilizer and some loving care to get a golf course in shape and keep it in top playing condition. The weather also helps, and Indian Lake's golf course maintenance crew responded to the favorable conditions in April by getting an early start in caring for the resort's two golf courses.

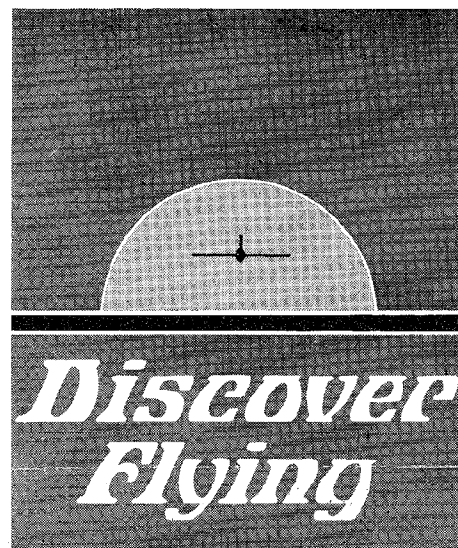

Objectives of the program are:

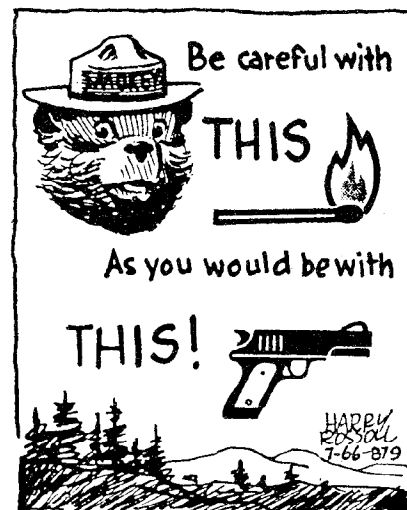
(a) To demonstrate general aviation's significant role in the nation's transportation and communications system.

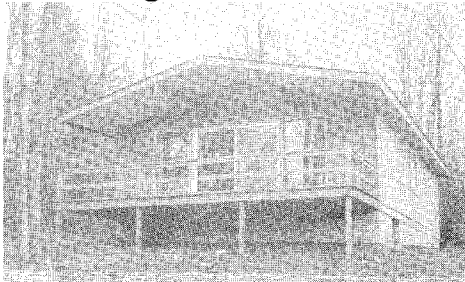
