

Men Qualify Aug. 4-17 for Golf Championship Aug. 18 Women Qualify Aug. 8 For Championship Aug. 15

Qualifying rounds and club championships for the men and women of Indian Lake will be held in August.

Action for the men gets underway August 4 when the first of 14 days for qualifying begins. The men will have up to and including August 17 to play 18 holes as a qualifier for the club championship. The 18-hole score will be used to determine flights. The card also will be counted as the first round score in the 36-hole championship.....

The women's qualifying round will be played Thursday, August 8. The title will be determined the following Thursday, August 15. Barbara Phenicie is the defending champion.

Francis Cmar of Latrobe will be back to defend his title among the men. Cmar is the fourth champion in as many years of competition over Indian Lake's 9-hole, par 36 layout. Arthur Poorbaugh won the first title back in 1964. T. O. Smith won the championship in 1965 and Joe Parker walked off with the honors in 1966.





BRISK PACE IN HOME BUILDING, LOT SALES



Home building and lot sales at Indian Lake are moving along at a brisk pace as more and more families seek to enjoy homes away from home.

The trend is likely to continue as Indian Lake moves closer to completing the Arnold Palmer designed championship golf course and 32-room condominium hotel.

Cautious attitudes on the part of mortgage lenders have produced a lag in new housing starts in some areas, but at Indian Lake vacation housing starts for the first five months of 1968 are up 25% compared to last year.

Pictures shown here represent some of the new home construction going on at Indian Lake. At top left is the vacation home of Mr. Raymond Mandigo of Greensburg. Terry Iseman is the building contractor. At top right, builder Ralph Guarino is nearing completion of the peninsula lakefront home of Mr. Donald B. Houghton of Pittsburgh. At right is the home of Mr. Albert P. Gunsser of Silver Spring, Maryland. It's located along one of the fairways of the new golf course and is being built by Wm. G. Baltzer & Son, Inc. of Shanksville.

Being in the middle of the normally peak buying months of July, August and September, the strength of the second home market at Indian Lake is almost certain to continue through 1968.

Moreover, the intensity of families fleeing crowded cities and suburbs for a quiet place in the country is expected to continue as more and more leisure time becomes available.





20% ahead of last year. This does not include the condominium hotel rooms at Indian Lake of which 85% are already sold. The hotel is the only condominium hotel in Pennsylvania.

Unlike condominium apartments or cooperatives, individual room owners in the condominium hotel share equally in a percentage of the hotel's total monthly rental receipts from all the rooms rented each month.



Game Farm

The game farm will consist of 575 acres and will provide sportsmen with controlled hunting of pheasant, chuka and quail from September 1 to March 31. In the 2,000-acre regulated hunting preserve there will be deer, turkey, rabbit, woodcock and squirrel. A full-time game manager will keep close watch on the continuing scientific propagation and game improvement program.

Open September 1

The new facilities are expected to be ready by September 1, 1968. Birds will be purchased for the game farm this first year.

The game farm and hunting preserve will be operated under Indian Lake Shooting Park, Inc., which now has a clubhouse, gun shop, trap and skeet shooting and indoor and outdoor rifle and pistol shooting.

More Trap and Skeet

Construction is underway at the Shooting Park to increase the number of trap and skeet fields from four to six, and to lengthen the rifle range from 100-yards to 200-yards.

Acquisition of the 2,575-acre tract gives Indian Lake 5,575 acres of recreation land. This includes the 750-acre lake which is believed to be one of the largest man-made, private lakes in the world.

Membership

Access to the game farm and hunting preserve will be through membership only. Application for membership may be obtained at the Shooting Park, or by writing to Indian Lake Shooting Park, Inc., R. D. 1, Central City, Pa. 15926.
