Standings Tight In "Go Anywhere" Sales Contest

Gary Williams of Pittsburgh is the first-month winner and leader in Indian Lake's "Go-Anywhere-In-The-World" referral sales contest.

Williams, although tied for total points with William G. Sutter, also of Pittsburgh, is the undisputed leader because of an earlier closing date for his sales.

The two men were credited with actual sales points plus bonus points which are available to them for their first five referral prospects.

Close behind these two top sponsors are nineteen others with bonus points and several referral sales waiting to be closed that could push them into the lead.

With the contest still in its early stages, the standings among sponsors will be changing almost daily.

The best way to get started in the contest is to take advantage of the 500 bonus points which are awarded for having the first five referral prospects sign the registration book. It doesn't matter if the prospect buys anything or not.

When the prospect does buy, then points are awarded on a descending value beginning with 6,000 points in March. Other months and point values are as follows: April, 5,800; May, 5,600; June, 5,400; July, 5,200; and 5,000 August 1 to September 5.

The earlier prospects are introduced to Indian Lake, the faster sales can be closed and highest point totals awarded.

-CONTEST RULES -

- Indian Lakes's 1970 ''Go Anywhere'' Sales Contest is open to all property owners at Indian Lake.
- The contest begins Sunday, February 1, 1970, and will continue in effect until 6 p.m., Sat-urday, September 5, 1970.
- Only new sales of property within Indian Lake will be credited to the sponsoring Indian Lake contestants. 3
- The property owner qualifies as a contestant when his first referral prospect signs the contest register.
- Sponsoring contestants need not be present Sponsoring contestants need not be present when prospective buyers come to Indian Lake. However, sponsors will receive points only after the prospect personally signs the contest register and indicates the Indian Lake sponsor. The contest register will be available in the Real Estate Sales Office at Indian Lake Airport
- Sponsoring contestants should, whenever pos-sible, make appointments for prospective buy-ers, or have the prospective buyer call in advance of his visit to Indian Lake.

The "Go Anywhere" sales contest is based on a point system with descending point values assigned to each month from February through August. Sponsoring contestants who receive credit for a lot sale in February will be awarded 6,200 points; for each sale: March 6,000 points; April 5,800 points; Aug 5,600 points; June 5,400 points; July 5,200 points; and 5,000 points August 1 to September 5. In addition to sales, contestants can accrue bonus points up to 500 based on 100 points for each of their first five prospects that come to Indian Lake.


Much of the recent sales activity has centered around the three new properties which were opened up for sale last month.



Spring Session For Flight Training School **Begins April 18**

Indian Lake's annual spring session for private and instrument pilot flight training will begin Saturday, April 18 at 11 a.m.

The private pilot session, which is open to persons 16 and over, will begin with ground school classes. In addition to classes in meterology, navigation and FAA regulations, students will receive up to three hours of instruction in the Link flight trainer. Except for time spent in the Link trainer, which is de-signed to teach flying skills without leaving the ground, ground school classes are separate from actual flight instruction.

The instrument pilot session also will begin April 18, but if a sufficient number show up the classes probably will be moved to another day so as not to conflict with the private pilot students.

Persons interested in the spring sessions for flight training may register in advance by calling the Air-Park. Reg-istration also will be held the first day of the spring session, Saturday, April 18.
