Favorable Response On New Membership Policy

Completed membership forms from lot owners for full recreational and social privileges through the lodge are being returned at a steady rate, according to Mrs. Myrt Collingwood, office manager at the lodge.

This unofficial report, as of May 10, shows total memberships to be way ahead of last year. All indications are that the remaining three weeks to June 1 should produce many more, and bring the total number of lot owners with full membership to the highest figure in the short history of the lodge.

The \$150.00 annual membership entitles husband, wife and all dependents residing in the same household unlimited use of the 9 hole golf course, ski slopes, swimming pool and tennis court, plus private social functions. June 30 is the deadline for the 1967-68 season.

Pro-rata credit is being given to all lot owners whose paid-up \$150.00 membership extends beyond June 1, 1967, which has been established as the annual renewal date.

The new membership policy produced many interesting comments, mostly favorable, but a fcw unfavorable. Anyway, the facilities at Indian Lake are among the finest to be found at any resort, and the \$150.00 is probably the lowest for a year's membership to the property owners.



Bus Service Begins

A regularly scheduled shuttle bus service for Indian Lakers has been set up, and is now operating initially on a weekend basis.

The bus route covers five major points around the lake area beginning with the lodge. Other stopping points are the marina, gun club, airport and around both sides of the peninsula. The complete run is a total of 12 miles.

bus used in carrying them back and forth from 5 major points around the Lake. Right now the bus is only running on weekends. Plans call for the service to be expanded during the summer months. The fare is only 15c one way.


The bus starts its first run at 9 a.m., Saturday, and finishes at 6 p.m. On Sunday the bus operates from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. The fare is 15c one way. Bus stop signs are being installed at the various stations.

Plans call for the service to be expanded to weekdays during the summer months. Also, as the traffic increases, the bus will make a run to West Shore Trail on the far side of the lake.



Riding Stable Opens June 2


Indian Lake Lodge is the place to go for Sunday dinner. See you there.

Good Investment in Condominiums



This picture of a model room shows the interior of one of the 32 units in the new condominium hotel which will be built this summer at Indian Lake.

The room is $14 \ge 25$ and will have 2 double beds, a day-night divan, shower, bath and vanity/sink refrigerator.

As a condominium, room owners can get a return on invested capital through pro-rata sharing of monthly rental receipts. Based on a 55% occupancy rate, room owners should receive approximately \$1,400.00 in annual income.

Almost anyone can own one of these rooms. The investment should be particularly attractive to some of the early property owners of Indian Lake and Lake Stonycreek who are now probably looking for another type of investment.

To the non-Indian Laker, there's more than just the investment potential in buying a room. Individual room owners become a part of Indian Lake's original charter of only 1500 property owners. This means they will have access to all social and recreational activities of the resort area.

Observe the Rules

Behaving on the Golf Course Is Easy

Golf is almost always played in the company of others. Therefore, everyone should understand how to behave on the course. Certain rules, or etiquette, are common to most golfers, even beginners, but they are always worth repeating.

An important thing to remember is that in addition to the safety of others there is a big investment in the golf course itself.

With these thoughts in mind, observing the rules makes more sense.

Here are some basic rules every golfer should know and observe:

1. Repair all divots. Do this by replacing the piece of turf torn up by your club. Press the grass down with your foot to encourage it to take root again.

2. Smooth out holes and marks made when playing out of a sand trap. Use the rakes provided for this purpose.

3. Avoid damaging the putting green. Repair (with a tee or similar object) all ball marks. Don't drop golf bags or the flagstick on the green, or pull golf carts across it. Also, don't lean on your club. It's no fun putting on a scarred green.

4. Do not drive motorized golf cars on or near tees, greens, or bunkers.

5. Do not talk or move while others are playing in your group. Do not stand too close to a player when he's shooting.

6. Do not hit your next shot until players in front are out of range.

7. When looking for a lost ball, allow players behind to pass. Do not hit until they have played through and are out of range.

8. Play without delay. Always be ready to hit when your turn comes.


9. After your group has holed out, go to the next tee immediately. Mark your scorecard on the tee, not the green.

10. Slow players having an open hole in front should allow players behind to play through.

All golfers should be familiar with the United States Golf Association Rules, particularly the changes that are made each year.

If you have a question about the rules, ask Jim Coleman, or consult your rule book. But remember, etiquette is important and makes golf more enjoyable.

HOME BUILDING CONTINUES TO INCREASE
