SKI TALK

By WILLI KLEIN, *Indian Lake Ski Pro*

First of all, I want to welcome all new property owners who are with SKI TALK for the first time. For you regular Indian Lakers, it's later than you think. So let's get going.

As long as skiing continues to grow in popularity in this country, there will always be new things to think about. But before thinking too much about new ideas and techniques in skiing, it's important in the beginning of the season to consider some fundamentals, which includes a conditioning program.

A well-known authority on skiing recently raised a good question on conditioning that is worth noting. "Are You in Shape to Get in Shape." In other words, a low level of fitness would require certain corrective measures before beginning a conditioning program that will assure you of getting the most possible fun out of skiing. And skiing is really fun.

I don't want to tell you HOW to get in shape. There are enough books and pamphlets available on this to guide you along. However, the best book in the world is of no value if you don't work at getting in shape.

These are just words of caution. You should know what you can and can't do as far as physical activity. Don't think you are too old, or out of shape to ski. Indian Lake has taken care of this to some degree by having the best beginner and family type slopes of any ski area. Just come out and try them. You'll have lots of fun.

Next month I'll try to talk a little about equipment—boots, bindings and other related gear. If you've never tried skiing before, it's a good idea to start out renting equipment here at the pro shop. Then after you get the feel of skiing, you can think about getting fitted up with your own skis, poles, bindings and boots.

In Austria, I grew up with skiing. It was a family way of life. It can be the same for everyone here at Indian Lake. Skiing is fun, it's safe, too.

Free Learn to Shoot Program Held Over

The Learn to Shoot Program at Indian Lake Shooting Center has been held over through December 31. The decision was made to allow for those Indian Lakers who were unable to attend sessions during the original week of November 13-19. The program is worthwhile, and it's free. There are no gimmicks.

Men, women and juniors (ages 14-18) can sign up for the program. Lessons are based on the fundamentals of trap and skeet shooting. Each session lasts approximately 90 minutes and runs for three consecutive weeks—the same time and day each week. Actual shooting time, with the help of professional instructors, is included in the program. Film strips are also used to acquaint shooters with the firearms family, types of shells, basic parts of a gun and how it operates.

Financial Assistance From VA for Flying

War veterans who served in the Armed Forces more than 180 days anytime after January 31, 1955, are in for some handsome benefits through the Veterans Pension and Readjustment Assistance Act of 1967. The act, signed into law by the President on August 31, 1967, provides reimbursement from the Veterans Administration for flight training.

To qualify for financial assistance a veteran need only to satisfactorily complete the number of hours of flight training instruction required for a private pilot's license, or to already possess a valid private pilot's license. Some medical requirements are also necessary. Maximum assistance allowed is \$4,680.

Work Continues On Front Nine of New 18 Hole Golf Course

Tree cutting on the fairways of the front nine holes of the new 18 hole championship golf course continues, while other construction activity on the course has been curtailed for this year.

Other than the month of July, which had 17 days of rain, work this year on the championship course went as well as could be expected. Arnold Palmer spent a considerable amount of time directing operations, and hopefully will spend as much or more of his time here next season. Seeding has been completed for this year. Progress to date shows 4 of the back nine holes seeded. They have taken quite well. The other five holes have the water line installed and will be ready for seeding in the spring.

All of the fairways on the front nine have been cut, and clearing work will continue as long as weather permits. With an early start in the spring, work on the front nine holes could move faster than the back nine.

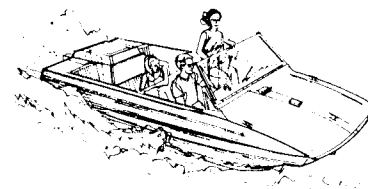

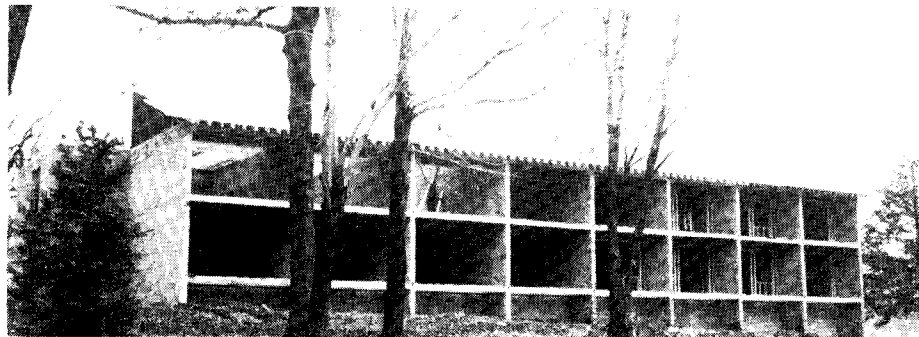

Work to Continue Throughout Winter

New Hotel Now Under Roof

Construction on the new 32 room hotel continues on schedule as workers completed the roof and will now extend all efforts towards having the hotel finished in February. Weather permitting, work will continue on the exterior of the 2 story block structure before moving in on major construction inside. Rough sawn siding goes on the outside of the building. Each room has private balcony.



Guests or room owners will have a beautiful view from any room in the hotel as sixteen of the 32 units overlook beautiful Indian Lake while the other sixteen have a scenic panorama that unfolds across the 9 hole golf course all the way to the lodge.

World's First

When completed, the hotel will have 32 individual investors based on the unique condominium arrangement. While there are many condominium apartments and vacation villas, the Indian Lake condominium concept is believed to be the world's first. Its been proclaimed as one of the newest and most workable ideas in the investment and real estate fields. The Arnold Palmer Island Inn on Eleuthera Island, Bahamas, is also being built under the same hotel room ownership principle.

A room in the Indian Lake hotel can be purchased for \$10,500.00. The down payment is \$3,500.00, with the balance financed up to five years. Monthly payments amount to approximately \$160.00. Using a 50% occupancy rate, room owners would receive approximately \$1,400.00 a year as their percentage of the monthly rental receipts.

The 100 unit hotel on Eleuthera Island, Bahamas, has a little different rate structure. A room in this hotel sells for \$11,500.00. Using a 63% occupancy rate, income is projected at \$2,660.00. Looking at the long term potential, the estimated earnings for the first five years are \$13,365.00.

Complete, unofficial returns for the election showed these results:

—Edward A. Specht and W. H. Garman were reelected to four year terms on the Borough Council. There was a tie for the third seat between Mearl N. Johnson and Clair R. Kimmel.

—Reelected for two year terms on Borough Council were Glenn Boyer and Mitchell T. Withrow. Two new office holders elected were Lucille P. Garman and Gloria Kimmel.

—Margaret B. Specht, Mary C. Withrow and Audrey Johnson were reelected as Borough Auditors.

—John Stoddard, with a whopping 30 votes, was the Borough's leading vote getter as he was reelected to a six year term as Constable.

—Walter Bocek was reelected Assessor, and Glenn Boyer and Theron Wider won six year terms of office as Justice of the Peace.

—Theron H. Wider, unopposed on the ballot, was reelected for the unexpired term of two years as Mayor over write-in candidate Glenn Boyer.

—Samuel Livengood was reelected Tax Collector.
