## No Hunting Allowed Within Indian Lake

All the ordinances within Indian Lake borough are important, but at this time of year there's one that should be called to the attention of everyone. It's the no hunting ordinance, and a portion of it reads as follows:

*Ordinance No. 6*—An ordinance prohibiting and discharge of any gun or any firearm and prohibiting the hunting of any game whether or not in hunting season within the Borough of Indian Lake and prescribing penalties of the violation thereof for the Borough of Indian Lake.

The entire ordinance on no hunting may be seen at any time at the borough office. For the information of all property owners, the following ordinances have been adopted by the borough council of Indian Lake since its organization.

*Ordinance No. 1*—An ordinance regulating motor vehicle traffic within the Borough of Indian Lake and for the protection of persons and property of the residents and their guests of the Borough and the abatement of nuisances resulting from improper motor vehicle traffic for the Borough of Indian Lake, Somerset County, Pennsylvania.

(This means that the Motor Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania is incorporated and made applicable in as far as the said Code applies to roads, streets and highways within a Borough and shall further apply as fully as if the entire Code was set forth herein. It has been deemed necessary and essential that certain regulations be imposed upon the use of the said private property for the health, safety and welfare of those who have a right to use the property, this being a lawful function of the police power of the Borough of Indian Lake.)

*Ordinance No. 2*—An ordinance regulating the erection, alteration and dem-

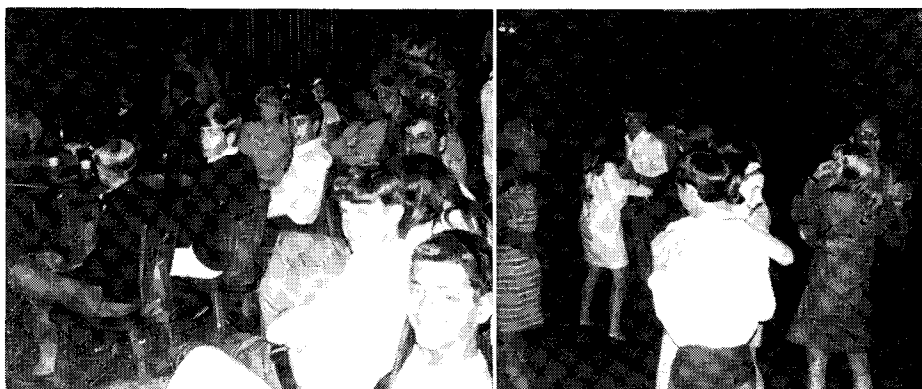

olition of all buildings and/or structures in the Borough of Indian Lake; requiring and providing for the issuance of permits and collection of fees therefor; requiring that plans and specifications be submitted and approved; and prescribing penalties for violation thereof.

(Permits can be obtained at the Borough Office. Fees are \$100 for new structures and \$5 for additions or boat houses.)

*Ordinance No. 3*—An ordinance establishing a Police Department in and for the Borough of Indian Lake, Somerset County, Pennsylvania.

(The Patrolmen are hereby exofficio constables of the Borough and shall, within the Borough, without warrant and upon view, arrest and commit for hearing any and all persons guilty of breach of the peace, vagrancy, nuisance, or disorderly conduct or drunkenness or who may be engaged in the commission of any unlawful act tending to impair the personal security or endanger the property of the citizens or for violating any Ordinance of the Borough.)

*Ordinance No. 4*—An ordinance establishing for the Borough of Indian Lake the positions of Secretary and Treasurer and defining the duties of each and providing for the performance of the duties of both offices by one person for the Borough of Indian Lake, Somerset County, Pennsylvania. (Lucille P. Garman is the appointed Secretary-Treasurer.)

*Ordinance No. 5*—An ordinance defining certain nuisances and the regulation thereof in the protection of health, welfare and safety of the residents of the Borough of Indian Lake, and the pro-

tection of their property, providing for the enforcement thereof and the abatement of said nuisances and prescribing penalties for violations.

*Ordinance No. 7*—An ordinance prohibiting disorderly conduct within the Borough of Indian Lake and prescribing penalties for the violation thereof for the Borough of Indian Lake.

The foregoing are just the headings of the Ordinances. The entire Ordinances may be seen at any time at the Borough Office. The phone number is 754-5400.

## NEW 18 HOLE CHAMPIONSHIP GOLF COURSE

Arnold Palmer is spending more time at Indian Lake now that his design of the new 18 hole championship golf course is taking a more definite shape. Brief descriptions of the back nine holes will be printed in future issues of THE SMOKE SIGNAL. In this way it is hoped that members can share in the enthusiasm Arnold Palmer has for Indian Lake and the new golf course. Plans call for the back nine to be seeded this fall, and possibly be ready for play in 1968.

## THE TEE

Here's a finishing hole that golfers will always remember. As a par 5, 540 yards long, it requires everything that the previous holes do in order to score well, namely, accuracy. First of all, it is long and narrow with both sides of the fairway heavily wooded. This means every shot will be a demanding one.

There's a 90° dogleg about 420 yards down the fairway. It will be virtually impossible to reach this green in two. In fact, it will be difficult to reach it in three.

The second shot must be well placed at the dogleg. It's possible to be stymied for the third shot due to a second shot that is either too short, or too long. There's also a cluster of tall trees in the center of the dogleg that could obstruct a clear approach to the huge, terraced green.

## THE APPROACH

The above picture shows the dogleg area and approach to the 18th green. Getting to the dogleg is one thing, but Arnold Palmer has designed a beautiful, two-level green with enough undulations that will have golfers expressing a sigh of relief after putting out.

The green is actually a double green. It joins No. 9 as one complete putting surface with some tall trees separating the two greens.

This hole is the first one scheduled for seeding next spring. The water line has been installed and the tee and green roughed in. Even though there is more work to be done before the 18 holes are completed, Arnold Palmer is designing a beautiful, championship golf course.

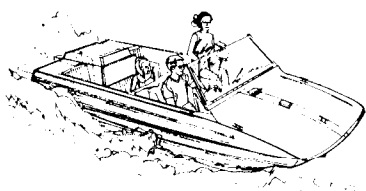
**Informal Get-Together****Family Ski Clinic

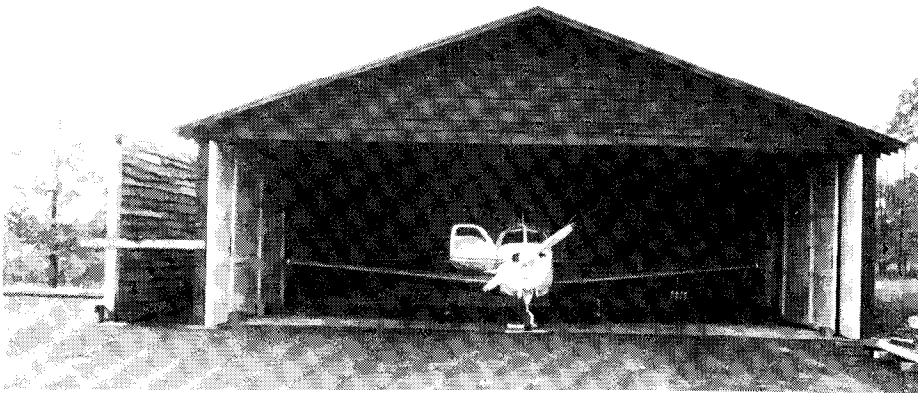

## Hangar Construction Moves Ahead



The first of four individual hangars for Indian Lake Air Park is nearly completed and work is already underway on the second one. Full sized at 32 x 42 feet, the hangars feature rustic siding, gable roof, sliding doors and inside lighting. A small hinged door provides easy access in and out of the hangar without opening the big doors.

The advantage of these hangars over the more common type T-units is that private airplane owners have space to keep a boat and car in with the airplane.

Traffic at the airport continues to increase and more and more airplane owners are making Indian Lake Air Park their base. The flight school also continues to grow as a number of new students recently enrolled in the fall session of ground school. Students can take the entire ground school at their own pace and not be concerned about keeping up with a class. This is as good a time as any to learn to fly. Stop in, or call Don Wonders at Indian Lake Air Park for complete details.

Ground school classes at Indian Lake Air Park are separate from actual flight instruction. There are no pre-requisites for the private pilot class. The classes are designed primarily to prepare students for the Federal Aviation Agency's written examination. A private or commercial rating is required for admission to the instrument ground school class.

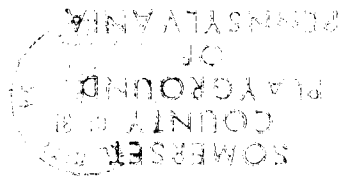
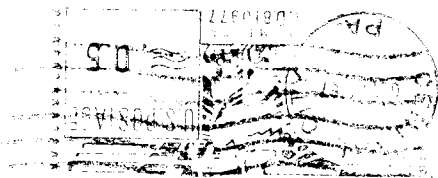
