

### Palmer Breaks 2 Course Records In Round With Contest Winners

Hodges, Stewart, Wagner, Lascheid, Long and Hallo Tee Up With Arnie

A relaxed and smiling Arnold Palmer joked with the gallery, belted 300 yard drives and set 2 course records for his 18 hole round of golf with the 6 referral contest winners Tuesday, September 5.

Making up the morning foursome with Arnold Palmer were Mrs. Betty Hodges, Cumberland, Maryland; Tom Stewart, Frostburg, Maryland (he was playing for non-golfing winner Lawrence Hitchins); and Paul Wagner of Stoystown.

Teeing up with Arnie in the afternoon were Dr. William Lascheid, Mt.

Lebanon; Tussie Hallo, Bridgeville (he got to play, thanks to Pete Calabro); and James Long of Barnesboro.

It was driver, wedge and putt for Palmer most of the day as he shot a record 5 under par 31 in the morning, and then came through with an even par 36 in the afternoon for a new 18 hole course record of 67. The old 9 hole course record of 32, and 18 hole score of 70, were held by Joe Parker of Johnstown.

Palmer got his birdies on 2, 6, 7 and No. 4 and 9 twice. His only bogeys came in the afternoon on No. 7 and 8. His drive on No. 7 landed in the pond in



### ARNOLD PALMER PLAYS GOLF AT INDIAN LAKE











front of the downhill 357 yard, par 4 hole. He used a 3 wood off the tee. In the morning round he used a driver, and carried the green on a fly. The ball rolled to the back edge of the green. Arnic chipped up to within 3 feet of the cup, and then knocked it in for an easy birdie.

The contest winners did remarkably well all day. Betty Hodges, wife of Indian Lake booster Dr. Royce Hodges, played extremely well. Her consistently straight drives really impressed Arnie. When she asked him once about her swing he said, "Don't change a thing."

Paul Wagner was also hitting big drives. His second shots got him into some trouble at times, but he made fine recovery shots. When asked about being nervous, Wagner said, "I just wanted to get a good drive off No. 1. Thinking about that gave me the shakes more than anything else." Paul's drive on No. I was straight down the left center of the fairway.

Tom Stewart had some real difficulties. But when he finally took Arnie's advice about keeping the head still, he boomed a tee shot on No. 9 that brought cheers from the crowd.

Of the six contest winners, Jim Long probably plays the least amount of golf. But he wasn't going to pass up the chance to play golf with Arnold Palmer for anything in the world. And, he held his own all day.

Bill Lascheid and Tussie Hallo played like they were trying to beat Arnie. In fact, Hallo probably thinks he could. (He's called the Great One). While Arnie exchanged small talk with the gallery, he kept an eye on Lascheid. Bill hit a drive on one hole that prompted Arnie to say, "You really hit that one, didn't you?"

Lascheid and Hallo both said they were nervous, and that they considered this a once in a lifetime event. They do share a distinction with Arnold Palmer. (If you want to call it that). When Arnie drove into the pond on No. 7, Lascheid and Hallo matched him.

Tuesday, September 5, is a day to remember at Indian Lake. Arnold Palmer made things look easy, and the gathering that followed him around saw for themselves a great golfer, a real gentleman and a nice guy. That's Arnold Palmer.

Picture Report of Arnold Palmer's Design

### **NEW 18 HOLE CHAMPIONSHIP GOLF COURSE**

Arnold Palmer is spending more time at Indian Lake now that his design of the new 18 hole championship golf course is taking a more definite shape. Brief descriptions of the back nine holes will be printed in future issues of THE SMOKE SIGNAL. In this way it is hoped that members can share in the enthusiasm Arnold Palmer has for Indian Lake and the new golf course. Plans call for the back nine to be seeded this fall, and possibly be ready for play in 1968.



No. 16 Par 4 400 Yards

The yardage on this par 4 hole is not long, but it is slightly uphill. There is also a slight dogleg right.

It won't be necessary to drive to the furtherest point in the dogleg, but the tee shot will have to at least make the top of the grade in order to have a clear shot to the green. There are a few pine trees bunched together near the center of the fairway that will play havoc with many drives.

The second shot to this green will be downhill. Most golfers tend to be long on a downhill shot to a green, but if the approach to this green is too strong it could end up in the water bazard behind the green.

There is still more work to be done on this hole. At this point, however, the hole is sure to have its share of bogeys.



No. 17 Par 4 360 Yards

This hole presents many interesting challenges. There are two small ponds located about 180 to 200 yards down the fairway. They are separated by some tall trees. The hole itself is straight away.

The golfer will have the choice of laying up short with his tee shot and, hopefully, hit the second shot between the trees. Or, he can gamble and try to go through the opening between the two water hazards. A strong drive will carry everything and be in perfect position for the second shot.

Arnold Palmer still has more work to do on this hole, as well as No. 16 and No. 18. There is no doubt that by the time he adds the finishing touches these holes will be beautiful, interesting and most challenging.

## Reservations Being Accepted For Occupancy in New Hotel
