Shooting Park Names Game Farm Manager

New Identification System To Start January 1, 1969

Special Reduced Rates on Recreation, Hotel Facilities With Proper ID Card

In the continuing effort to make Indian Lake more enjoyable and to provide property owners with as many benefits and privileges as possible, a new system of identification will go into effect January 1, 1969.

Under the new system, all property owners will receive an identification card for Indian Lake. This one card gives property owners a permanent membership in Indian Lake Lodge and is to be used as identification when using any of Indian Lake's facilities.

The membership card will be encoded to indicate two supplementary privileges (1) Property owners with season passes, and (2) Property owners with charge accounts. Renewal date for the \$150.00 season pass is still June 1.

Membership cards for season-pass holders will be coded to indicate the date for renewing the free and unlimited family recreation privileges.

For property owners who do not have season passes, but have valid charge

accounts (charges paid within 30 days), their membership gives them reduced daily rates for golfing, skiing, swimming, ice skating and tennis. The reduced rates also apply to all members who have valid credit cards when staying in the new Indian Lake Hotel or Chalets. The special rates, which amount to as much as a 20% reduction, may be paid either cash or charge as long as the account remains valid (charges paid within 30 days).

Many property owners already have established charge accounts at the Lodge, but in order to start this new system properly it is necessary that those who wish to continue their charge account and take advantage of reduced rates on the facilities, or those who wish to establish credit for the first time, complete an application form and return it to Indian Lake Lodge. Use the form which was mailed to you, or complete the form on Page 3 of this newsletter.

Charge accounts will remain valid as long as all charges are paid within 30 days of the monthly statement date. Once a charge account has been invali-

Referral Contest Moves Into 2nd Month

With the first blast of winter coming earlier than usual this year, the thoughts of many Indian Lakers quite naturally turn to skiing. But for many others their thoughts must be of a tropical island vacation because referrals in Indian Lake's latest contest are continuing at a steady pace.

The new contest, which has moved into its second month, features grand prizes of vacations for two in the Bahamas.

Expense-paid trips will be awarded to the three top sponsors of new property owners. The prizes will include round trip jet flights to Eleuthera Island and rooms and meals for seven days and six nights at beautiful Arnold Palmer's Island Inn.

Contest winners will be determined through a point system. For every personal referral (prospect comes to Indian Lake) that results in a sale, the sponsor receives 100 points. For every name referral (Indian Lake goes to the prospect) that results in a sale the sponsor receives 50 points.

Name Referrals

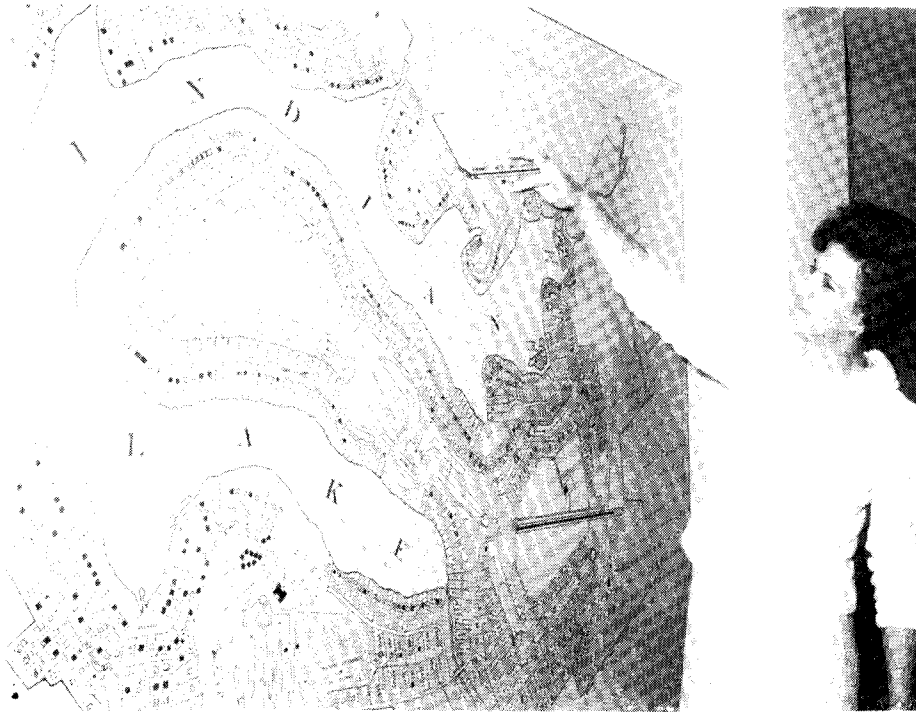

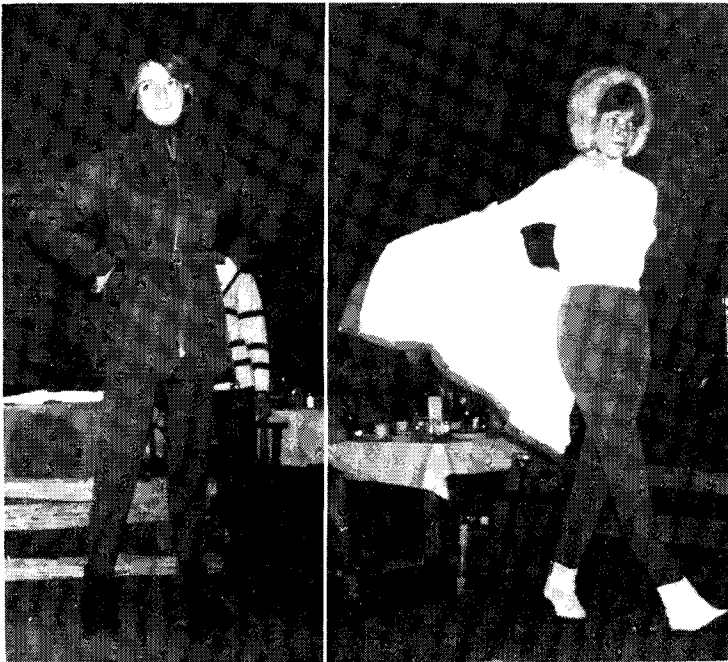

Berlin, Stoystown Banks Merge to Become County's Third Largest

The First National Banks of Berlin and Stoystown merged November 18 to become known as the First National Bank of Somerset County. The merged bank is now the third largest in Somerset County, with the Berlin bank and its branch in Shanksville having combined deposits of \$5.3 million and the Stoystown bank \$2.1 million.

The merger was approved under the charter of the Berlin bank by the national comptroller of currency.

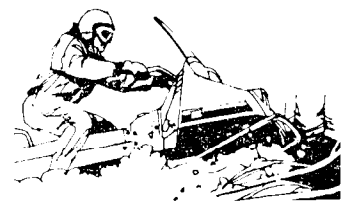
Earl D. Croner, who was president of the Berlin bank, is now president of the merged bank.

Richard Shetler, who headed the Stoystown bank, is senior vice-president of the new bank.
