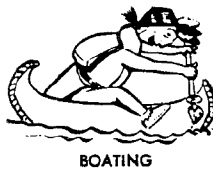

Contest Winners to Play Golf With Arnold Palmer Sept. 4

Race For Top Honors Tightens As Sept. 2 Deadline Approaches

The six leading sponsors of new Indian Lake property owners will play golf with Arnold Palmer, Wednesday, September 4, at Indian Lake. That's the date Arnie said he'd be here to meet and play golf with the Indian Lake tub thumpers who have been credited with the highest number of sales in the latest Indian Lake referral contest.

Tee off time for the front nine holes is 10 a. m. A luncheon with Arnold Palmer for the six contest winners will follow the morning round. The second 9-hole round will start at 1 p. m.

32-Room Hotel Now Open

Indian Lake's 32-room hotel is open for occupancy. The two-story structure, located just below the chalets and tennis court on South Shore Trail, was officially opened with fanfare on Saturday, August 10. Demand for the new facility forced an unofficial opening as early as July 20.

Construction is continuing on outside areas of the building. The spacious rooms inside the hotel are completely furnished except for a few small items which are en route from the manufacturer. The items will be installed as quickly as possible.

Each room has two double beds, day-night divan, sitting room, shower, bath and vanity-sink refrigerator. Guests have their own private balcony from which to enjoy the magnificent setting. Sixteen of the units overlook beautiful Indian Lake while the other sixteen units provide a panorama of the 9-hole golf course and Lodge.

Unique Feature

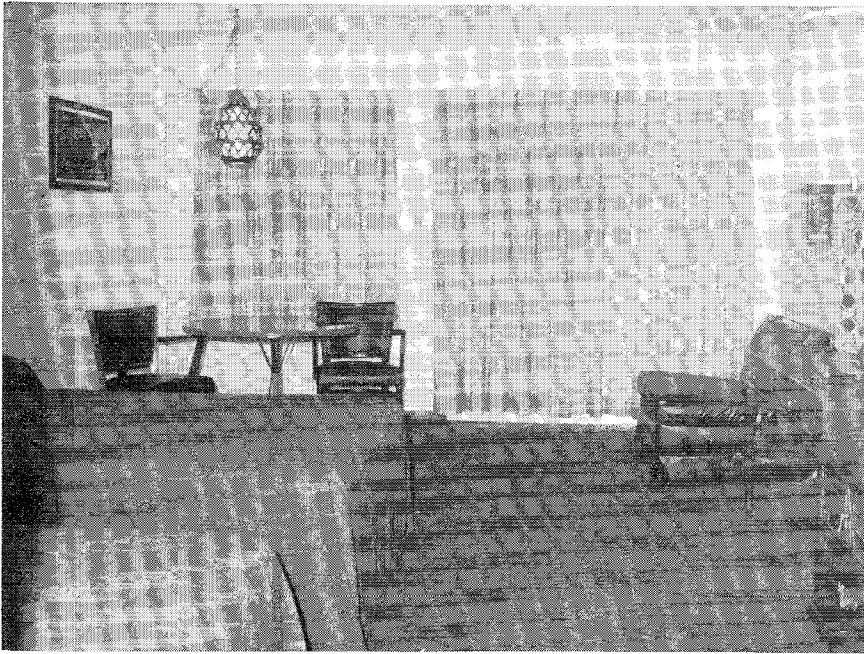

Dave Watson Wins Wagner Golf Event

Twenty-one-year-old Dave Watson of Pittsburgh shot a steady 40-38-78 that was good for a net score of 74 and a one-stroke victory over Joe Parker and Francis Cmar in the second annual K. H. Wagner Memorial Golf Tournament. The tournament was played under a one-half handicap.

Watson started off the back nine with a par and a bogey. Then he put together four straight pars before bogeying No. 16. But he came right back with a par on the tough 17th—known as "The Monster"—and a par on the final hole to win the top prize of a \$175.00 gift certificate.

Joe Parker, 1966 club champion, had the day's best gross score with a 77. What little trouble he had came early as he double bogeyed the first two holes. He finished 77-2-75.

Cmar, who was among the late starters, needed to match his opening round of 38 on the back side to win. Like Parker, double bogeys—on the 15th and 17th—cost him the title. The 1967 club champion finished 78-3-75 to share second place with Parker. Each received \$110.00 gift certificate.

Bernie Nosworthy 85-7-78 and Don Enderlein 87-9-78 tied for third place.

Nosworthy earned his tie with a spectacular birdie 4 on the 18th. After a good drive, he pushed his second shot way off to the right. The ball came to rest in deep rough just short of the practice putting green. From there, Nosworthy executed a brilliant golf shot by lofting the ball over the sand trap and onto the sloping green. The ball hit above the pin, rolled past the cup, and stopped 10 feet below. Calmly, Nosworthy knocked it in for his birdie and a split of the \$100.00 gift certificate with Enderlein.

Jack Metzgar had 88-9-79 for sixth place. Defending champion, Jack Butler, shot 84-4-80 and finished in a tie for seventh.

Plans Nearly Completed

Water System To Be Improved

Indian Lake has nearly completed its plans to provide more dependable water pressure to its property owners and general use areas in the 3,000 acre development.

Plans now are to provide for a system of water storage to overcome low pressure during periods of peak demand, and to maintain a more uniform pressure in the distribution of water in the entire system. Indian Lake's fresh water source is from wells.

With strategically located storage tanks, water from the main lines can be used to fill the tanks when demand on the system is at its lowest, which is usually between midnight and early morning.

Water Conservation

The increased number of cottages and overall expansion of the development has prompted the need for more uniform water pressure and additional capacity. The situation will be corrected as quickly as possible.

Meanwhile, it would be advisable for property owners to think about the water situation before watering lawns, washing automobiles, or other unnecessary use of water.

Boating Regulations Apply to Everyone

Fines and Suspension For All Violators

Regulations for the use of Indian Lake apply to everyone, not just a few.

Indian Lake Service Corporation, of which all property owners are members, has issued a reminder that violations of the boating laws for Indian Lake, U. S. Coast Guard and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania could result in a fine and suspension of all boating privileges.

Two regulations that boaters should be more aware of are: (1) 40 mile per hour speed limit and (2) No water skiing after sunset.

Indian Lake boating regulations were mailed to all property owners in April. Additional copies may be obtained at the Lodge, or from the Indian Lake Safety Patrol Officer.

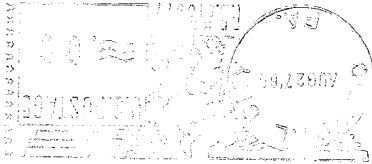
