Lodge Takes On New Look

Indian Lake Lodge has taken on a new look as the first phase of a three-part program to remodel the Lake's social hub has been completed.

Now, anyone who saunters up to the bar in the big dining room can relax and enjoy their favorite cocktail in the quiet company of others, or they can unwind and not feel as though they are putting on an exhibition for those who are having dinner in the dining room.

Using Indian Lake's symbol of rustic living - rail fence - the bar has been enclosed (not completely) from top to bottom. Some space was left open for the musical sounds of the great ones, Hans Stumpf & Jimmy Russell. While the bar (it's really more like a cocktail lounge now) will never be a fortress for those who may sometimes over-indulge, the change does provide a little more privacy between the dining area and bar. It's a definite improvement and is much more cozier than it was before. You'll have to see it to appreciate it.

The other phases of the remodeling program, which include changing the main entrance and making the banquet room the main dining room, will be completed as quickly as possible.

Answer To A Demand

New Townhouse-Type Vacation Units And Cottage Sites Now Open For Sale

There's good news for property owners who would like to earn points the easy way in the "Go-Anywhere-In-The-World" referral sales contest.

In answer to an increasing demand for carefree, townhouse-type vacation units, and vacation homesites with lake frontage for boat docking, Indian Lake now has available for sale three new types of properties that are part of the corporation's original 1,500 property owner plan.

The new townhouse vacation units will be built at the north end of the Lodge parking lot, overlooking the ski slopes and lake. Designed for maximum flexibility in terms of interior floor planning, the units feature kitchen, dining area and living room downstairs, and bedrooms and bath upstairs. The kitchens will be complete with stainless steel sink, built-in countertop range and oven, and a two-door refrigerator.

The exterior of the building will be finished in attractive brick and cedar shingles. Optional provisions are available to the owners for maintenance and income producing rental. Prices for a basic unit start at \$18,750.

Defends Title Successfully

Randy Guarino Wins Giant Slalom

Fourteen-year-old Randy Guarino of Indian Lake moved through a 600-yard, 20-gate course in 34.1 seconds to win the 1970 giant slalom ski race and become the first skier in five years of Indian Lake competition to win two consecutive championships.

Randy's winning time, which was 1.5 seconds better than runnerup Rick McIntyre, helped lead his family to three other victories in the big race.

Sharon Guarino recorded the best time among women skiers with 40.7, while big Ralph Guarino, father of the two Guarino teenagers, barreled through the gates in 38.6 seconds to win the men's division.

The Guarinos had an easy time in winning the family trophy as they turned in a combined time of 1.13.7, which was some 30 seconds better than the Hamiltons of Greensburg, and the Daggett family of Johnstown.

Rick McIntyre, who won the Indian Lake giant slalom title in 1967, and also this year's time trials, was timed 35.6 for his second-place finish in the overall competition. Jim Schenck of Pittsburgh took third place at 36.2.

Barbara Yourd, from Indiana, Pa., captured runnerup honors in the women's competition with a time of 41.4 seconds. Johnstown's Nike Cotchen was clocked in 41.6 seconds for her third place finish. Defending champion Sandy Garman was out to make it four in a row in women's competition, but she finished fourth with a time of 43.

Indian Lake's 1970

"Go Anywhere"

—CONTEST RULES—

1. Indian Lakes's 1970 "Go Anywhere" Sales Contest is open to all property owners at Indian Lake.
2. The contest begins Sunday, February 1, 1970, and will continue in effect until 6 p.m., Saturday, September 5, 1970.
3. Only new sales of property within Indian Lake will be credited to the sponsoring Indian Lake contestants.
4. The property owner qualifies as a contestant when his first referral prospect signs the contest register.
5. Sponsoring contestants need not be present when prospective buyers come to Indian Lake. However, sponsors will receive points only after the prospect personally signs the contest register and indicates the Indian Lake sponsor. The contest register will be available in the Real Estate Sales Office at Indian Lake Airport.
6. Sponsoring contestants should, whenever possible, make appointments for prospective buyers, or have the prospective buyer call in advance of his visit to Indian Lake.
7. A total of six (6) "Go Anywhere" travel prizes will be awarded with grand prize being a "Go-Anywhere-in-The-World." In addition, there will be a mystery prize for each monthly winner from February through August.
The "Go Anywhere" travel prizes are as follows:
FIRST PRIZE — Go Anywhere — in the world
SECOND PRIZE — Go Anywhere — North America, South America, Europe, Far East
THIRD PRIZE — Go Anywhere — North America, South America and Europe
FOURTH PRIZE — Go Anywhere — North America or South America
FIFTH PRIZE — Go Anywhere — North America
SIXTH PRIZE — Go Anywhere — Continental United States
*Prize values are as follows: 1st prize \$4,000; 2nd prize \$3,500; 3rd prize \$3,000; 4th prize \$2,500; 5th prize \$2,000; and 6th prize \$1,500.
8. In addition to the travel prizes, sponsoring contestants will receive a year's season pass to Indian Lake for each lot sale credited to them. For example, five referral sales would give the sponsor five years of a paid-up season pass.
9. As a special incentive to prospective buyers, each new lot owner will receive a year's season pass to Indian Lake.
10. The "Go Anywhere" sales contest is based on a point system with descending point values assigned to each month from February through August. Sponsoring contestants who receive credit for a lot sale in February will be awarded 6,200 points for each sale; March 6,000 points; April 5,800 points; May 5,600 points; June 5,400 points; July 5,200 points; and 5,000 points August 1 to September 5.
In addition to sales, contestants can accrue bonus points up to 500 based on 100 points for each of their first five prospects that come to Indian Lake.
11. To qualify for 1st prize, sponsoring contestant must have a minimum of 25,000 points; 2nd prize 20,000 points; 3rd prize 15,000 points; 4th prize 10,000 points; 5th prize 5,000 points and 6th prize 5,000 points.
12. Sponsoring contestants and their wives will be invited to monthly cocktail parties where the contest standings will be brought up to date and monthly prizes awarded. The cocktail parties will be held from 6:30 to 8:30, March 7, April 4, May 2, June 6, July 4, August 1, and September 5.
13. Winners in the "Go Anywhere" sales contest may take their prizes as outlined above, or some approved variation. There will be no trading for cash or merchandise.
14. Employees and relatives of Indian Lake, its associated firms and advertising agency are not eligible to participate in this contest.
15. Contestants in the "Go Anywhere" sales contest will be guests at a dinner party Saturday, September 5, 1970, when the grand prizes will be awarded.

Other new winners this year were Nicki Will of Central City, who won first place among girls 8 and under, and Mary Lou Miller, from Pittsburgh, who breezed through the gates in 43.3 seconds for fastest time among women 18 and over.
